

(VFC) program was signed into law as a part of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993, and now celebrates 30 years of saving lives by removing cost as a barrier to timely immunization. **VACCINATE** YOUR FAMILY is proud of the prominent role our co-founders played in encouraging the Clinton Administration to focus on childhood vaccines, which ultimately spurred the creation of the VFC program.

"After the measles epidemic of the late '80s and early '90s, Senator Dale Bumpers rallied his colleagues. He took to the Senate floor to lament 27,000 cases of measles, cases he called 'totally shameful and avoidable.' He challenged his colleagues to rise to their responsibility to protect our children. Our children have

been lucky to have his heart and his voice at their service." -PRESIDENT BILL CLINTON

Within two years of the establishment of ECBT in 1991, our co-founders traveled to more than a dozen states and ultimately to all 50 states to foster vaccination efforts and build immunization coalitions. They were the true catalysts behind the VFC program and our organization has worked to alert families to this program, direct them to services and remove additional barriers to life-saving vaccines for three decades. The passage of the VFC program 30 years ago is evidence of the profound impact grassroots efforts can have on healthcare policy.

Since the Act was signed into law in 1993, the vaccines provided through the VFC will prevent more than one million deaths. 472 million illnesses and 29.8 million hospitalizations among children.

From The CEO



FAMILY—and the public health community more broadly—navigates the fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic, one thing has become abundantly clear: our Co-Founders Former First Lady Rosalynn Carter and Former First Lady of Arkansas Betty Bumpers had it right.

VYF is returning to our roots by reengaging a ground-up approach to coalition building, with new community partners at the core of our efforts. We are on course to reignite a culture of immunization in the United States.

In 2023, we lost our co-founder, colleague, and mentor Rosalynn Carter. Reflecting on her legacy of a life of service has galvanized our commitment to saving lives from vaccine preventable diseases. In response to the measles outbreaks of the early 1990s, Betty and Rosalynn traveled from state to state, engaging in a grassroots approach to vaccinating the nation's children. They started in their backyards of Arkansas and Georgia in the 1970s and eventually traveled to all 50 states, galvanizing community members and helping to form immunization coalitions.

Our co-founders were also instrumental in spurring the establishment of the Vaccines For Children Program (VFC), which celebrates 30 years of saving lives through vaccine access this year.

Today, we celebrate more than 1 million lives saved through routine childhood vaccinations in the United States over the past 30 years—but we also find ourselves at a tipping point. Routine immunization rates in America's children are wavering. Access to affordable vaccines for all ages—and healthcare more broadly—is far from universal. Gaps in vaccination rates are growing as disparities in access continue to impact African American/Black and Hispanic/Latino communities disproportionately.

Vaccinate Your Family is going back to our roots to meet this moment, focusing on grassroots, ground-up approaches to vaccine promotion. Our Vaccination Community Navigator Program supports Community Health Workers and Promotores (in English and Spanish) in becoming vaccine advocates for their clients. The Vaccination Collaborative serves

as a learning forum and collective action network

for community partners involved in vaccine advocacy and promotion. We continue to train WIC providers to bring vaccines into the portfolio of resources they offer their clients. Our social media and digital campaigns leverage our network of local partners as trusted messengers to make vaccine messages meaningful. And we have a lot more work to do.

The first 30 years of the Vaccines For Children (VFC) Program are worth celebrating—and the next 30 years will challenge us to meet the moment, to adjust our approach, and to center health equity and vaccine access in our quest to reignite a culture of immunization in the United States. We're going back to our roots to make it happen. We look forward to continuing this work together.

Vaccination Community Navigator (VCN) Program

PARTNERING WITH COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS/ PROMOTORES TO BUILD VACCINE CONFIDENCE

The Vaccination Community Navigator (VCN) Program is a comprehensive, bilingual curriculum for Promotores/ Community Health Workers (P/CHWs), designed to build their capacity to engage their communities in vaccine conversations and navigate people of all ages to vaccination services. P/CHWs play an integral public health role in their communities and serve as trusted messengers and as such they are uniquely positioned to serve and support under-resourced communities with vaccine information that increases vaccine confidence. knowledge, and access. In 2022, this program was piloted in Texas with more than 200 Community

Health Workers and CHW Instructors and was met with tremendous success. In early 2023. Vaccinate Your Family launched the VCN program nationwide and expanded it to include an online community and virtual Community of Practice meetings. In 2024, the VCN program will continue to grow in size and scope and will begin including in-person training sites. The in-person training sites address the technological barriers often found in underserved and rural

EMPOWERING WIC PROVIDERS TO BECOME VACCINE MESSENGERS


VYF spearheaded efforts ensuring the U.S. Department of Agriculture's WIC (Women, Infants, and Children) program staff reviews the vaccination records of children they serve. Half of the children born in the U.S. each year utilize WIC services. As a result of our ongoing education of WIC staff and participants for two decades, millions of women have learned about the value of vaccines, understood the availability of programs such as Vaccines

For Children and Children's Health Insurance Plans to help pay for vaccines, and been guided to healthcare providers as needed.

In 2023, Vaccinate Your Family hosted two webinars for WIC staff: one on the updated COVID vaccine guidance, and another on routine immunizations for kids. Vaccinate Your Family also provides WIC staff with the latest vaccine guidance in the form of printable resources and digital lessons.

Good Health WINs

A MODEL FOR COMMUNITY-BASED IMMUNIZATION WORK

Good Health WINs (Women's Immunization Networks) is a partnership with the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW) to support advocates within the African American community to communicate the importance of immunizations and work to create an infrastructure for good health. This is achieved by reducing health disparities, increasing vaccination opportunities and education, and identifying the drivers of vaccine hesitancy. The National Pan-Hellenic Council recently joined the Good Health WINs community, expanding the program's reach to approximately four million African Americans. Our partnership with Good Health WINS continues to be a model for partnering with community-based organizations to boost vaccine confidence and immunization rates.


PARTNERING WITH COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS
TO PROTECT CHILDREN MOST AT-RISK FROM COVID-19

In 2023, Vaccinate Your Family created a unique campaign, together with a network of community-based partners, to encourage vaccination of children under 5 against COVID-19. COVID vaccination rates in children under 5 remain low, with more than 90% of Black and Hispanic children (and 88% of White children) remaining unvaccinated. Vaccinate Your Family partnered with community-based organizations to create culturally relevant, tailored communications messages and strategies to promote the vaccination of young kids against COVID.




OUR STRATEGY

Deciding to vaccinate yourself or your family is a big decision and should not be made lightly or without forethought. VYF believes everyone should be able to make an informed decision based on current, science-based, and rigorously tested research. Just as importantly, VYF also believes that once that decision has been made, everyone should have equal and affordable access to lifesaving vaccines. That is why vaccine policy is a major aspect of the work VYF does. Educating policymakers at the federal and state level helps ensure that communities can obtain quality healthcare. Conveying accurate vaccine information to the public

ensures that communities have a trusted resource to help combat the mis and disinformation that has seen an alarming rise in social media and other media platforms. To ensure that vaccine partners across the country have access to up-to-date, science-based vaccine information, legal arguments, and policy, VYF maintains a Partner Portal on our website. The VYF Partner Portal has over 392 individuals representing immunization coalitions, state and national medical professional societies, and other vaccine advocates. Our partners can utilize the resources provided by VYF to support pro-vaccine policies that include equity and affordability.

In the first year they were available, COVID-19 vaccines saved 20 million lives worldwide and billions in societal costs. A study of flu vaccination rates found that only


