# 2025: THE MOMENTS That Defined the Year

In a year defined by uncertainty, Vaccinate Your Family (VYF) stood firm. Our 2025 Annual Report, *Meeting the Moments*, reflects how VYF's 35 years of expertise, stability, and trusted leadership helped families and communities navigate challenges to vaccine confidence, science, and public health. Explore the moments that shaped our year, and the programs, partnerships, and advocacy that positioned VYF as the rock families and policymakers rely on.



Here are some of the moments which threatened vaccine access, policy, and trust in 2025, and the ways in which VYF stood firmly for science, equity, and evidence-based policy:

## February 2025

- The newly inaugurated administration issued an executive order establishing the Make America Healthy Again (MAHA) Commission, marking the beginning of significant changes to federal health programs and funding.
- The administration then issued an executive order prohibiting federal funding for schools and higher education institutions that require COVID-19 vaccination for attendance. Notably, prior to this executive order, no state had school immunization requirements for COVID-19 vaccines.
- Amid an ongoing outbreak of measles and for the first time since 2015, an unvaccinated child in Lubbock, Texas died from measles.



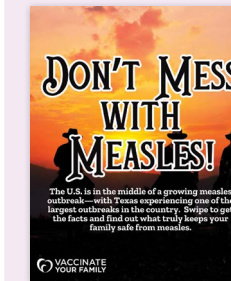

## March-April 2025

- The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced a new research initiative to examine the rise of autism spectrum disorder in the United States, drawing significant public attention and concern, particularly following the hiring of known anti-vaccine activist David Geier to support the study.

- Due to messaging coming from HHS, we saw a resurgence of anti-vaccine myths across the country.



**Countering Misinformation in Real Time:** As vaccine myths surged, VYF developed engaging social media posts delivering timely, evidence-based information, reaching thousands of people across platforms.

## May 2025

Without consultation from the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) withdrew its recommendation for COVID-19 vaccination in children and pregnant women, an unprecedented break from standard scientific review process.

**Elevating Lived Experience:** VYF secured national media coverage—including a powerful feature in *People* magazine—amplifying advocate stories to humanize vaccine-preventable diseases and reach millions.

## June 2025

- HHS removed all sitting members of ACIP. This action raised widespread concerns about scientific independence and the continuity of evidence-based vaccine recommendations and policy.
- The newly reconstituted ACIP convened for its first public meeting, voting to remove thimerosal from flu vaccines despite having no new scientific evidence to do so.

**Multiplying Impact Through Partnerships:** VYF crafted response letters and ready-to-use toolkits for coalitions, state health departments, and other partners, enabling trusted messengers to reach their audiences with clear, evidence-based information.

## July 2025

Dr. Susan Monarez assumed leadership of the CDC at a time of significant federal instability, tasked with navigating evolving political pressures and public skepticism. *She was removed 28 days later.*



**Mobilizing Public Engagement:** Ahead of every ACIP meeting, VYF equipped partners and the public with clear agenda insights and calls to action to submit public comments, then delivered rapid explanations of decisions and their real-world impact. Prebunking efforts included a primer on the importance of the hepatitis B birth dose and why our immunization schedule differs from other countries like Denmark.



**Expanding Education Access:** VYF launched the redesigned Vaccination Community Learning Program, expanding access to trusted, science-based vaccine education for learners nationwide. The program reached over 400 enrollments in its first six months alone.

## August 2025



Following the release of a Danish study that showed no link between aluminum exposure in children through vaccines and instances of autism spectrum disorder diagnoses, the Secretary of HHS released an article misrepresenting the results and claiming the opposite is true.

## September 2025

- During the September ACIP meeting, the Committee removed recommendation for the measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella (MMRV) combined vaccine for children under four years old.

- At a press conference, the President and Secretary of HHS claimed a link between Tylenol use during pregnancy and autism, despite substantial scientific evidence contradicting such a connection. They also included language amplifying the disproven theory that vaccines cause autism spectrum disorder.

Across 2025, rapid shifts in federal policy, communication, and agency leadership generated deep uncertainty for families and public health systems.

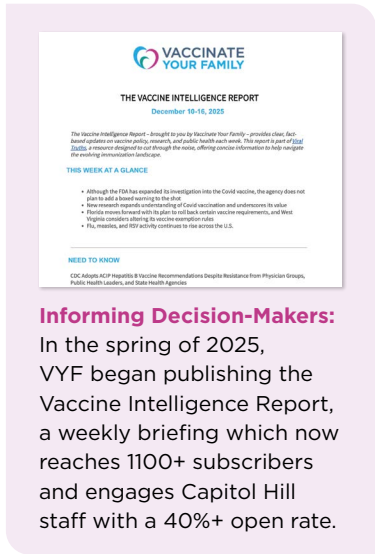

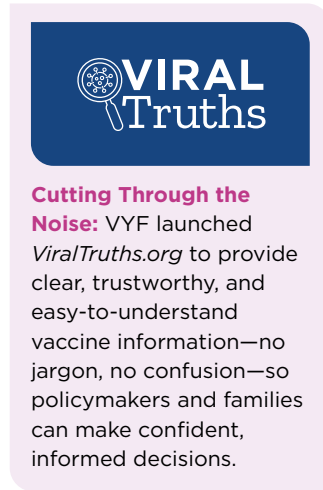
## November 2025

CDC updated its “Autism and Vaccines” webpage to suggest the statement “vaccines do not cause autism” is not based on evidence, abandoning decades of rigorous science that has time and time again shown that vaccines do not cause autism.

**Informing Decision-Makers:** In the spring of 2025, VYF began publishing the Vaccine Intelligence Report, a weekly briefing which now reaches 1100+ subscribers and engages Capitol Hill staff with a 40%+ open rate.



## December 2025

At its December meeting, ACIP voted to roll back the universal hepatitis B birth dose recommendation, a dangerous step backward for children's health and undermining decades of proven public health progress.

# A LETTER From The CEO



**35 years.** A legacy of prevention.  
A future of protection.

Thirty-five years ago, a massive measles outbreak spurred the founding of our organization (as Every Child By Two) by former First Lady Rosalynn Carter and Betty Bumpers. Their vision was clear and urgent: no family should lose a loved one to a disease we know how to prevent through immunization. That vision has saved countless lives—and it continues to guide our work today.

In those early years, the challenges were stark. Families lacked medical homes. Providers lacked computer systems to track children's vaccination status. Transportation barriers made care difficult to access. Dual-working families faced inflexible clinic hours. Awareness about the importance of timely immunization was limited. Today, we refer to many of these obstacles as social determinants of health.

Because of decades of dedication—from advocates, healthcare providers, policymakers, and partners like you—progress has been made. Lives have been saved. Communities have been

strengthened. Prevention has become a cornerstone of public health.

Yet the truth remains: many of these barriers should have been fully overcome by now.

Instead, we find ourselves once again at a moment in time when children, adolescents, and adults are dying unnecessarily from vaccine-preventable diseases. This reality underscores why our work—and your partnership—has never been more essential.

This past year was enormously challenging, but it was also deeply meaningful. Your continued dedication to protecting families and preventing disease made a

real and measurable difference. Even as we navigated change and uncertainty, our focus never wavered. We continued to educate and advocate while elevating the voices of those impacted by vaccine-preventable diseases.

As we look ahead to the coming year, we do so with energy, resolve, and gratitude, grounded in our legacy and focused on the future. Our work remains centered on four core areas:

- Sharing accurate, trusted vaccine information with families and communities
- Advocating for policies that expand access to lifesaving vaccines

- Elevating the voices and stories of people impacted by vaccine-preventable diseases
- Educating partners and supporting their efforts to increase vaccine confidence

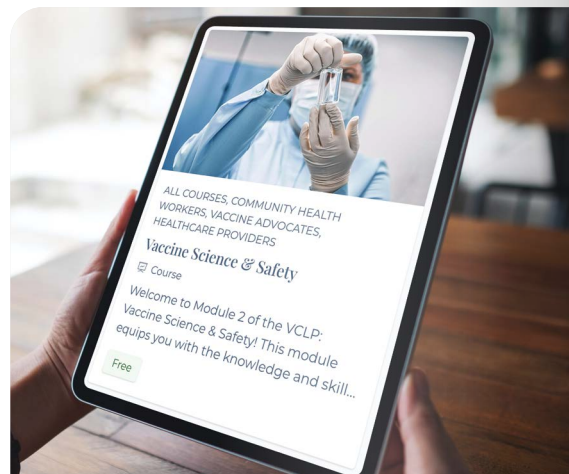

## The Vaccination Community Learning Program

VACCINATION EDUCATION LEADS TO  
VACCINATION CONFIDENCE

As questions and demand for trustworthy vaccine education continue to grow, VYF's education programs are meeting the moment by equipping communities with accessible, timely, and credible learning opportunities.

Since 2022, the **Vaccination Community Navigator (VCN)** program provided free, bilingual (English and Spanish), community-level education for community health workers, promotores, and others seeking to deepen their understanding of immunizations and build confidence in promoting vaccines.

This year, VYF recognized the need to expand and strengthen this work, launching

the **Vaccination Community Learning Program (VCLP)**, a newly redesigned, free-to-all flagship education program structured around four core modules:

- Vaccination Foundations
- Vaccine Science and Safety
- Building Vaccine Confidence
- Overcoming Vaccination Barriers

Each module features accessible, bite-sized lessons designed to be completed at an individual's own pace, helping learners build a strong understanding of vaccine history, science, and practical application.

In the fall, VYF also released supplemental mini-courses on influenza, COVID-19, and

respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), timed to support communities ahead of respiratory virus season.

In less than six months, there have been more than 450 enrollments in the VCLP. In 2026, the program will expand further with a full Spanish-language translation and new mini-courses focused on hepatitis B, measles, and pertussis.

# SQUAD™ Advocacy Program

## THE STORIES THAT SHAPE POLICY

Behind every immunization statistic are real people—survivors of vaccine-preventable diseases and those grieving loved ones lost too soon. At VYF, we work to lift up the stories behind the numbers, meeting each moment of immunization conversation and change with the undeniable truth of lived experience. That's the purpose of our SQUAD™ (SQuaring Up Against Disease) advocacy program: to bring advocates together; to train them on vaccines, vaccine-preventable diseases, and how to share their stories in ways that feel safe, supported, and effective; to help them engage their communities around the impact of vaccines; and to stand beside them, offering our support as they step into the broader advocacy space.

SQUAD™ members share their stories to serve their

communities and honor their loved ones, and VYF helps make that possible. Whether contributing to the VYF story library or meeting with congressional leaders, our advocates were supported and reminded throughout 2025 that their stories deserve to be heard.

## THEIR STORIES MATTER, RESONATING MORE DEEPLY THAN SCIENCE.

In October, eleven SQUAD™ members gathered in Washington, DC, for three powerful days of community-building, training, and direct advocacy. Together, they strengthened their skills, deepened their connections, and brought their lived experiences to the lawmakers



and staff who shape vaccine policy now and for the future. Their time on Capitol Hill underscored what we already know: when survivors, parents, and advocates speak with one voice, real impact follows.

SQUAD™ advocates were also supported in adding eleven new personal narratives

to the VYF story library, documenting real, human experiences with vaccine-preventable diseases. From hepatitis B survivorship to the heartbreaking loss caused by *Haemophilus influenzae type b* (Hib), each story offers a powerful snapshot of a life forever—and unnecessarily—changed.

# SQUAD™ Community Activations

## FROM ADVOCACY TO IMPACT

SQUAD™ community activations are grassroots initiatives designed to empower advocates and community partners to bring accurate, culturally relevant vaccine information and access directly into their communities, especially those that are directly impacted by vaccine-preventable diseases.

EACH ACTIVATION IS  
 TAILORED TO THE NEEDS  
 AND STRENGTHS OF THE  
 COMMUNITY IT SERVES.

Activities may include vaccine education workshops, resource sharing, peer-to-peer conversations, pop-up vaccine clinics, and/or culturally resonant media campaigns. Many activations are led by SQUAD™ members—trusted messengers with strong community ties who are trained to lead conversations, dispel myths, and guide their neighbors toward informed, confident health decisions. VYF backs these activations with mini-grants that support outreach materials, staffing, event costs, and collaboration with partners.

Through your 2025 support, **VYF provided over \$100,000 to 16**

# Women, Infants, & Children (WIC) Program

PROTECTING OUR MOST VULNERABLE POPULATIONS WITH VACCINE EDUCATION

For more than 25 years, VYF has partnered with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and their Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program to deliver trusted vaccine education through a resource families already rely on. In collaboration with the National WIC Association and the USDA, VYF hosts an annual webinar for WIC staff and develops clear, accessible immunization resources for both staff and clients.

Nearly half of all children born in the United States—and pregnant women—participate in WIC, making it one of the most effective channels for reaching families. VYF's webinars have equipped thousands of WIC staff with knowledge and confidence to address vaccine questions, while client-facing resources help parents and parents-to-be understand the importance of vaccines. VYF also supports online vaccine lessons and resources for WIC participants in both English and Spanish.

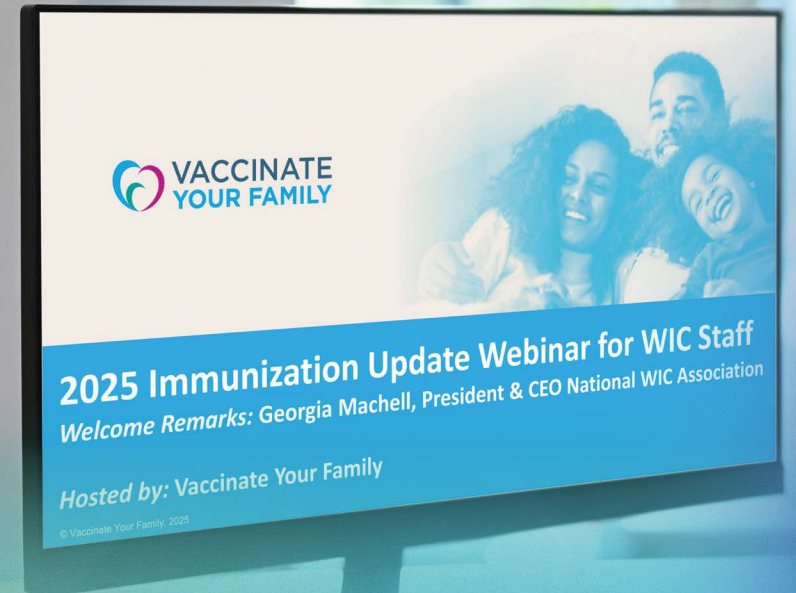

## The Vaccination Collaborative

### FROM CONNECTION TO ACTION

The Vaccination Collaborative is a national network dedicated to strengthening immunization efforts through shared leadership. Through monthly calls, an active listserv, and a partner portal, partners exchange insights, share emerging data and resources, and elevate best practices, supporting science-based programs and policies.

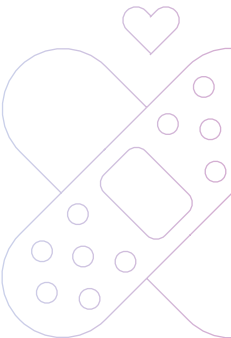
The Vaccination Collaborative includes more than 900 individuals representing over 400 partner organizations, working to advance vaccine advocacy, communications, policy, and education. In addition to monthly calls, partners have access to a secure, password-protected online portal designed to support collaboration and information sharing. This shared space includes a partner directory, vaccination policy resources, and practical tools to help ensure organizations are connected, informed, and activated.

In 2025, monthly Vaccination Collaborative meetings addressed a wide range of timely and complex topics, including the childhood immunization schedule, hepatitis B, vaccine ingredients such as thimerosal and aluminum, and a myth-busting panel focused on countering persistent rumors across the vaccine landscape. Speakers included experts from a diverse set of organizations, such as the Autism Society of America, Immunize.org, the George Washington University School of Law, the American Medical Group Association, and others.

Together, the Vaccination Collaborative strengthens the impact of organizations working to protect public health.

# Monthly Policy Calls

## STAYING ALIGNED IN A CHANGING LANDSCAPE

Vaccinate Your Family's monthly vaccine policy call serves as a broad convening space for leaders across the immunization and public health landscape.

Designed as an inclusive umbrella, these calls bring together federal and state policy leaders, legal experts, coalition representatives, state health department leaders, and other public health officials to share timely information and align efforts across jurisdictions and disciplines.

With anywhere from 50–80 participants each month, the calls follow a structured

agenda that includes federal and state policy updates, coalition priorities, and legal developments affecting vaccine access and policy. By creating a consistent forum for information-sharing and dialogue, VYF helps ensure that partners remain informed, connected, and prepared to respond to emerging challenges, thus strengthening coordination and collective impact in support of evidence-based immunization policy.

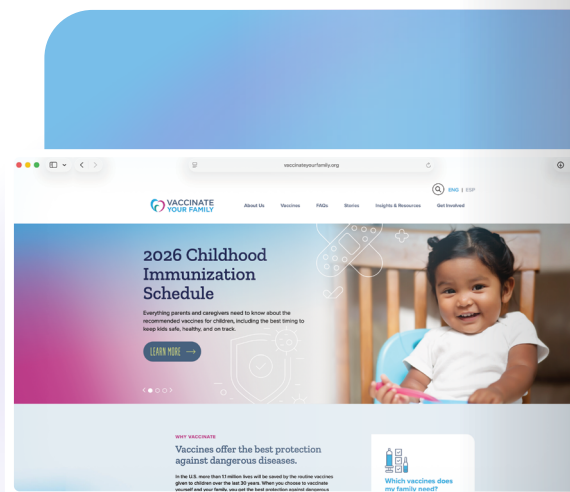

### CRITICAL INFORMATION AT YOUR FINGERTIPS

VaccinateYourFamily.org provides trusted, science-based information about vaccines across the lifespan. The site answers frequently asked questions, explains the latest immunization schedules, and offers evidence-based information about vaccine safety, including research and the systems that protect communities.

Visitors can explore personal stories that illustrate the real impact of vaccine-preventable diseases, download free educational resources, or access

a password-protected portal with toolkits designed for partner organizations and advocates.

In 2025, VYF published 31 new articles on the "Insights" page, responding in real time to policy changes and vaccine safety claims. Content is offered in English and Spanish, in multiple formats, and has been accredited by the World Health Organization as a Vaccine Safety Net-certified website—helping communities access reliable, timely information and meet the moment when it matters most.

Launched in 2025, the weekly Vaccine Intelligence Report provides essential updates on public health policy, disease outbreaks, and evidence-based rebuttals to trending claims, ensuring that those working in vaccine education and advocacy

can meet the moment with confidence and clarity.

To complement the weekly bulletin, the ViralTruths.org website delivers timely, accurate information about vaccines and vaccine safety, designed to keep

pace with today's fast-moving communication environment. The site is updated regularly to address trending vaccine claims, and it curates links to expert commentary, helping communities and partners respond quickly to misinformation.

# Social Media Campaigns

## MEETING PEOPLE WHERE THEY'RE AT

At VYF, we transform science-based vaccine information into clear, easy-to-read communications designed for social media. Our goal is to make it simple to be pro-vaccine, providing the public and vaccine advocates with sharable materials and timely information on the latest and most important topics.

Social media communications are not designed to convince the vaccine-hesitant that they must seek out vaccines. Instead, our mission is to provide a reliable, trustworthy source so that people can make informed decisions for themselves and their families.

In a digital landscape where misinformation and disinformation can spread like a virus, our challenge is to deliver safe, compelling content that counters rumors, conspiracy theories, and falsehoods. We meet that moment by meticulously researching facts and relying on trusted sources to inform every post, graphic, and shareable resource.

Our expertise and outreach extend beyond social media. By elevating VYF experts and advocates through targeted earned media, we secured placement in over 30 articles in 2025, reaching audiences through more than 500 national syndications. This generated significant engagement—13.3K interactions, 39 journalist shares, and an estimated 635.5M unique monthly visitors across outlets. Notable placements included **the Associated Press, The Atlantic, ABC News**, and more, amplifying our message and reinforcing our role as a trusted source for vaccine information.

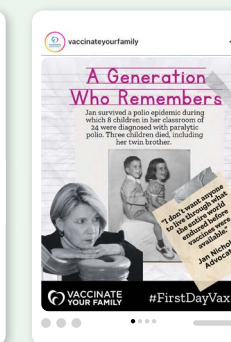

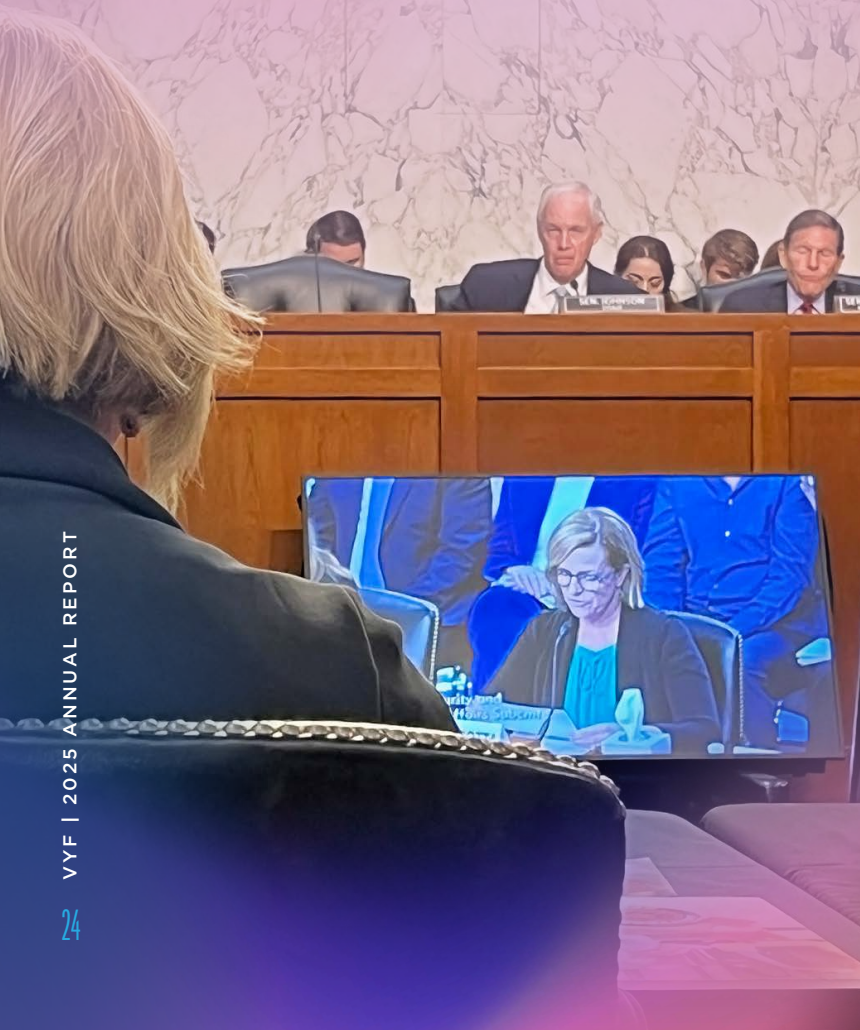

## Policy

EVIDENCE-BASED LEADERSHIP IN  
A RAPIDLY CHANGING LANDSCAPE



VYF has long been a leader in vaccine policy, working alongside coalitions and public health partners to educate lawmakers on policies that expand vaccine access, advocate for funding to strengthen immunization infrastructure, and share lived experiences that illustrate the real-world risks of low vaccination rates. In response to sweeping changes in vaccine policy in 2025, VYF adapted its approach to a rapidly evolving landscape and emerging threats to the immunization ecosystem.

By expanding policy capacity with the addition of a Government Affairs Lead and a consultant with vast governmental experience, VYF responded with agility, providing credible, evidence-based information to policymakers and partners.

In May, VYF launched the weekly Vaccine Intelligence Report, providing clarity and context on vaccine-related news. Over the course of six months, the newsletter grew to reach 325 congressional staffers across more than 220 offices each week, as well as almost 800 partners and public health leaders nationwide.

Throughout the year, VYF increased congressional engagement, communicating regularly with key health committees to inform bill content

and sponsorship. VYF advocate and Deputy CEO Serese Marotta served as a witness at a Senate subcommittee hearing, underscoring the importance of vaccination. Through coalition memberships, VYF staff participated in multiple Hill Days, advancing discussions on the evolving roles of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), increased funding for Section 317, and protections to ensure access to vaccines without cost-sharing.

VYF also activated grassroots networks through action alerts and online campaigns, encouraging advocates to urge the White House and Congress to protect vaccine access, including support for the Protecting Free Vaccines Act.

Throughout the year, VYF increased engagement with federal agencies, submitting public comment prior to all four ACIP meetings and providing oral comment at two meetings. VYF also participated in high-level meetings with agency leadership to better understand priorities related to vaccines, immunization coverage, and pandemic preparedness.

# The State of the ImmUnion® Report

DELIVERING CRITICAL UPDATES AND GUIDANCE ON THE NATION'S IMMUNIZATION LANDSCAPE

When we released our *State of the ImmUnion®* report in early 2025, we already knew the truth: the nation's immunization ecosystem was precarious. The report urged Congress to expand access to lifesaving vaccines and encouraged policymakers to share their own personal experiences with vaccines and vaccine-preventable diseases, helping to humanize what can too easily be reduced to statistics. Even then, however, we could not have fully anticipated the scope or speed of the changes that would unfold over the course of the year.

As challenges to immunization have increasingly emerged from the highest levels of government, VYF's focus has necessarily shifted. We are working urgently to protect the hard-won gains of past decades so our country does not slip backward and so fewer children and families face preventable illness and loss.

Looking ahead to 2026, the *State of the ImmUnion®* report will continue to evolve alongside a rapidly changing vaccine system. Supporters can expect frequent updates, timely briefings, and clear, credible information delivered directly to their inboxes, ensuring they remain informed, prepared, and engaged on the issues shaping immunization and public health.
